Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to M.D. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Babarpur, Sikandra, Agra-287007, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0509) with intake capacity of 54 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **M.D. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Babarpur, Sikandra, Agra-287007, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0509)**, inspection was conducted **on 03.04.2025 and 04.04.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) to process **the permission with intake capacity of 54 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

I. Teaching Staff:-

- a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{25}{30} \times 100\% = 83.33\%$ (Excluding Excess)
- b) Shortcomings in teaching staff are as under :-

- a) Average bed occupancy percentage is 40.85%. **(Shortcoming is 09.15%)**

- 3) Further, **an opportunity of clarification was given to the college for the aforementioned shortcomings/defects found during assessment and same was communicated to the college vide letter of even no. dated 14.07.2025. In response of the same you have submitted the clarification vide an email dated 14.07.2025 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. MDACH/2025/250 Clarification dated 21.07.2025.**
- 4) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully re-examined in terms concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was placed in the **130th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held **on 03.07.2025 and On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of even number dated 04.08.2025 to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on 06.08.2025, to present their case and to show cause as to why not the permission with 54 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2025-26. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no. MDACH/2024/51 hearing, dated 05.08.2025 against the deficiencies conveyed to them**
- 5) Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Atri, Principal and Dr. Vikas Mishra, Secretary, of the college** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **06.08.2025** and made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

IV) Kayachikitsa (HF)-We submitted the promotion order of Dr Jagdhane Sandip Anna Teacher Code-AYKCD2810 for your reference (letter enclosed). Even though the faculty had more than 7 years' experience, previous College had not promoted him. He was appointed in the college before the submission of Part-1, but was not promoted and hence a shortcoming of higher faculty in Kayachikitsa department is shown part-1. The promotion order was sent to NCISM on February 18, 2025 (Mail Enclosed) and the process was under technical officer. The faculty was present during the inspection (Photo Enclosed).

v) Shalaky a Tantra (HF):-One of our faculty Dr Pratima Devi's debarring case was under the honorable high court of Allahabad and the case was disposed on 22-02-2025. The OTMS portal was with drawn on 15-02-2025 and hence we were not able to upload the name of Dr Varun Kumar Setia, who was appointed in the place of Dr Pratima Devi. Mails regarding this was sent to NCISM on 22-02-2025, 15-03-2025 etc. (Copy Enclosed) The faculty was present during the inspection {Photo Enclosed}. The appointment was under process in NCISM under Technical officer and was later appointed before the visitation, but not shown in the Part-1 he was later linked to our college by NCISM on 11-04-2025

12.02.2025 in the dept. of Kayachikitsa as a Assistant Professor and promoted as a Associate Professor on 18.02.2025 and also resigned in the month of June 2025.

Kayachikitsa Faculty namely Dr. Pallavi Patil was resigned from the post of Associate Professor on the date 12.09.2024. College was not recruited any faculty during the period of 13.09.2024 to 11.02.2025. Though faculty namely Dr Jagdhane Sandip is present on the day of Visitation. At present Higher Faculty is not working in the Dept. of Kayachikitsa.

Submission of the college regarding faculty namely Dr. Jagdhane Sandip Anna may not be considered as an eligible teacher.

V) Shalaky a Tantra - College authorities have submitted that Shalaky a Tantra Higher Faculty namely Dr. Pratima Devi was withdrawn on 15.02.2025 and Dr. Varun Kumar Setia joined on same post and resigned on 23.07.2025.

Submission of the college regarding faculty namely Dr. Varun Kumar Setia may not be considered as an eligible teacher.

I. Peon/attendant:- One Peon is lagging in the part-1 and it shall be considered under 20% relaxation as per order no: File no-26-75/MARB/2025 dated 20/01/2025 (Order Enclosed).

II. Analytical Chemist:- This is due to a clerical error in the data entry as staff coded H16 (Khushboo Bhagel) was entered instead of staff C-11 (Uma Jain). Both staffs are entered in Part-1 in Hospital Staff and non-teaching staff respectively.

I. College authorities admitted that they don't have one Peon/attendant.

II. College authorities have stated that Uma Jain was shown as a college staff and they were unable to include her name in Hospital staff as a Analytical Chemist, hence they were uploaded the name of Khushboo Baghel instead of Uma Jain.

Shortcoming Partially fulfils.

III. Functionality of the hospital:-

- a) Average bed occupancy percentage is 40.85%. (Shortcoming is 09.15%)

The Bed occupancy we maintained in our institution during 2024 January 1 to 2024 December 31 was above 40% as per the MSR 2016.(Copy

As per instruction received from NCISM dated 09-01-2025, it was told to maintain an average bed occupancy of more than 50% and hence we are maintaining a bed occupancy of more than 50% since then, which was verified by the NCISM visitors. IV. AEBAS clarification a) It was observed that few teaching faculty members are not meeting the minimum required attendance percentage of 65% till day of visitation. b) Further the Board issued a show cause vide ref 3-4/U.P/MARB/2025-Ay (91) dated 05.05.2025. c) It is submitted that the Board is in receipt of a clarification from M.D. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Babarpur, Sikandra, Agra-287007, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0509) vide ref no MDAC/206/2025 dated 07.05.2025. On verification of compliance received with regards to AEBAS showcause : - Revised percentage of attendance data from AEBAS for the period from 19.02.2025 to 29.06.2025. 05 faculties out of 19 are having attendance percentage below 65%.															AEBAS clarification 1. Dr Rajiv Laxmikant Bhosekar : - The faculty was not having teacher's code even though the faculty was having experience to be appointed as reader / professor. He was present during the inspection. He was appointed in our institution on 22/02/2025, his teachers code was received on 24/04/2025 and registered in AEBAS on 29/04/2025 since then the faculty is having regular. (AEBAS attendance details attached). 2. Dr Sruthi O. :- The faculty of Kyachikitsahas taken medical leave from 7-4-2025 to till date (medical documents attached). In her place we had Appointed Dr. Sreejaya (teacher code: AYKC03664) for the normal functioning of the college & hospital on 7-04-2025 (appointment and joining letter attached) and she is linked to our institution from 13-5-2025 by NCISM and she is registered on AEBAS on dated 17-04-2025 (AEBAS details enclosed). 3. Dr K G Beena :- The faculty of sharir Rachana has taken leave due to personal reason ie. marriage of their son Document, leave letters, marriage and engagement card sand photos attached. AS the faculty was availing long leave and was disturbing the normal functioning of the college, we requested for resignation on 12-06-2025, there after she resigned from our college dated 03-07-2025. Offer letter is send to Dr. Geethu was sent on 2-7-2025 which was approved by the teacher 4. Dr PV GIRI :- The faculty has taken leave due to personal reason that is marriage of their son Document, leave letters, marriage and engagement cards and photos attached. AS the faculty was availing long leave and was disturbing the normal functioning of the college , we requested for															AEBAS Clarification: 1. College authorities have submitted that Faculty namely Dr Rajiv Laxmikant Bhosekar was appointed on 22.02.2025. CCTV footage provided by college is not confirming his regular presence at college. 2. Dr Sruthi O.: College authorities have submitted that Faculty namely Dr. Sruthi O. is on Medical leave from 07.04.2025 to till date today. Leave application of Dr.Sruthi is not approved by Principal, and also same was not remarked by inward no. Documents are not satisfying her absence. Dr. Sreejaya (AYKC03664) is appointed & joined on 07.04.2025. 2.Dr K G Beena: Faculty was resigned from college on date 03.07.25. 4. Dr PV GIRI: Faculty was resigned from college on date 03.07.25. 5. Dr Sravya mV: Dr. Sravya joined on date 13.01.2025 After observing teacher staff attendance register it was noticed that Dr. Sravya was signed the register on the day of joining only, afterward she was not signed. Documents provided during hearing observed that she was not regular staff of college. College has submitted CCTV Camera Footage, which is not of adequate dates and not fulfilling the regular attendance of Teaching Staff. College nor submitted any other relevant proofs to prove the regularity of the said faculties in the college. However college should maintain attendance on AEBAS as per norm and also maintain CCTV footage as per the

5. **Dr Sravya mV** : The faculty has taken maternity leave and she was absent during the visitation also and the documents were verified by the inspection team.

Dr. Keerthana was appointed in our institution on 1-3-2025 and teachers code was received on 24-3-2025 and her name was not added in part 1 , she was present during the visitation (photo enclosed) As she got admission for PhD in AIIA Delhi she was relieved on 9-06-2025, later offer letter to Dr Sudeshna was sent on 3-7-2025 and was approved by her.

The college has updated the location details in AEBAS ON 14-05-2025. (screenshot attached)

- 6) Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and the assessment report was duly placed before the **140th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine for **Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)** held on **12.08.2025** and **Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulation but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letters issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025.** Further, the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for extended permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as Conditional Permission with seat reduction was issued to the college, for the academic year 2024-25. However, the Board decided to issue Yearly Permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy approved by in 122nd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 14.05.2025 in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2025-26, wherein it is mentioned that:-

As per the seat reduction policy 2025-26:-

- a) "For deficiency of **every one teacher**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."

Further, as per **Board's policy letter for assessment of Ayurveda colleges issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025** "The 10% Relaxation in the requirement of the teaching staff may be extended for the Academic year 2025-26. Therefore, the colleges with 60 and 100 intake capacity shall have minimum of 27 and 40 teaching staff respectively fulfilling the requirements of the individual departments separately"

Accordingly, there is deficiency of 02 teachers for issuance of Yearly Permission for academic session 2025-26 under Section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2025-2026, for deficiency of two teachers, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10% of total intake capacity.

- 7) **Hence**, after applying the seat reduction policy 2025-26 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **yearly permission with 54 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) as per regulation 54(3) of MESA&R for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.**

"DECISION"

- 8) **Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, M.D. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Babarpur, Sikandra, Agra-287007, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0509) is hereby granted with:-**

Yearly permission with seat reduction policy in UG (BAMS) course with 54 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.

- 9) **The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-**

- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of with 54 seats [instead of 60 seats]** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

- 10) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

- 11) **Further, the Board was in receipt of a letter vide ref no. MDACH/2025-26/115 dated 03.07.2025 from you requesting to allow to pay the balance amount of Rs. 50 lakh out of imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 01 core in academic year 2024-25 and remaining penalty shall be paid on or before 28.02.2026 and the request was placed the 140th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 12.08.2025 and Board approved the request of the college and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 14.08.2025.**

- 12) **Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college**

is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**

- 13) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 14) **You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
- 15) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, shall be fulfilled.
- 16) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
